POPULATION HEALTH TRAINING PROGRAM OVERVIEW

he National Population Health Colloquium is offering a Training Program, sponsored by the Jefferson School of Population Health, in the form of an optional continuing professional education course within the conference for attendees wishing to take a deeper dive into the Colloquium's subject matter.

Who Should Attend?

- 2. Please describe the post meeting online examination.

The post meeting online examination is a multi-question examination based upon the information made available in the preconference reading, preconference training, and the Colloquium agenda. Participants may take this examination at any time during the ninety (90) days following the Colloquium. They will be given a web link to the examination and a unique username and password to access the examination. Candidates will have one hour to complete the examination once begun. The examination may be taken up to three (3) times. New questions will rotate through the examination. Candidates must score seventy percent (70%) or more to successfully complete this requirement.

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


